It has been a busy week at Capel this week, with some fantastic learning and some very poignant moments, as we all observed a two-minute silence on Wednesday in memory and respect of our armed forces. We have also carried out more virtual Parent Consultations which seem to have gone down well. Many of you may have heard about the Governments investment into schools to support vulnerable children that may need some help to catch-up with gaps in their learning. The fund is designed to provide additional resources, tutoring or other means to address various areas of learning. I am delighted to tell you that the school has received the first wave of funding and we have partnered with a local tutoring company. They will be working with some children throughout the year, providing a ten week, individualised tutoring program. We will contact you separately if we are offering this opportunity to your child in this first round, to inform you of the process and for your consent. The tutoring will take place in school, with one session per week over a period of ten weeks. They will be assessed at the beginning to identify very specific gaps, and at the end to see the difference it has made. We are delighted to be able to start this process, and whilst we would love to be able to offer it to all children, our priority are those whose learning was most impacted by the lockdown. The second wave of tutoring will start after the February half term and the third at the beginning of May. If you have any questions regarding this, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Next week we have an exciting 'Odd-socks' day on Monday—this is to mark our Anti-Bullying Day. Mrs Waters has given more details further on in the newsletter. You will also see a section letting you know about our Christmas plans which will need to be a little different this year. We are determined to make sure it is as fun and celebratory as ever.


Christmas plans in school

After-school club made a stunning tribute which they proudly displayed in the front of the school too.


