

Online Safety

DO YOU KNOW?

One of the challenges that faces all parents is keeping in touch with what our children are doing online. With many now having their own phones, and being able to access apps for social media, it can be a minefield. Keeping our children safe on these forums is paramount. This means that we, as parents, need to be able to talk to our children about what they are doing, and to be able to have access to their phones. Peer pressure can lead our children to do things that they wouldn't normally do, so we need to approach these issues with open discussion and understanding. For some of our children, Whatsapp can be problematic and I urge parents to talk to their children about the groups chats that they are in. There can be a risk of being treated unkindly by others who would never do it face to face, or they might get caught up in some unkind chat themselves. As they get older and move to Secondary schools, they need to be self assured and confident in using these apps safely to reduce their vulnerability, which is why we take it so seriously in Primary School.
