

As the Christmas holidays beckon, I wanted to give you a short update on what we Governors have been doing lately to support Capel School.

Firstly, we are delighted that we have a new Parent Governor in our team: Bukky Obidairo. Perhaps you already know her from the school run? She is well able to represent parents' views at our meetings.

The Lockdown and phased return to school disrupted the children's education in a number of ways. The School put together a Covid Recovery Plan that assessed the children's needs individually to provide them with the best catch-up support. We have reviewed the plan. We are very satisfied that Mrs Farr's approach is absolutely right. It is very thorough and the staff are carrying it out in the best possible way.
