REMEMBER:

Please let us know if anyone in your household tests **positive** for Coronavirus. It is vital that we are informed as soon as possible in case we need to take any action. If you are selfisolating due to contact with someone who has tested positive, please make sure you let us know that too.

We continue to be fortunate , managing to keep all our bubbles open, but please remain alert to the possibility that a bubble would close following a positive case. This could mean that we ask you to collect your child quickly, and remain away for a set time. In this situation, remote learning would be reinstated through the use of Teams. Please let us know promptly if you require the use of an iPad in this situation.

Our play equipment is back in use and we have a special rota for the use of it. Each class will have a week dedicated to them, enabling the equipment to be used everyday as it will stay within one bubble. It will be thoroughly cleaned before another bubble uses it the next week. It is therefore, very important, that other children DO NOT **USE** the equipment after school. If others go on it, we will have to stop a class using it to allow for guarantine time. We know that some families like to socialise and chat after school which is absolutely fine, but please do not allow your children, whether school children or younger, to use the equipment. Please can I also ask that you remind your friends if they forget and allow their children on it. Thank you.





Behaviour Policy

We have been able to start implementing our new Behaviour Policy in school this week. We have posters around the school and in classrooms, reminding the children of our three rules:

Be ready

Be respectful

Be safe

There is also an exciting addition to classrooms—The Recognition Board. The whole class have a target to work towards, and those pupils meeting it have their name added to the board. It is so lovely to be able to walk into a classroom and immediately see those children that are striving to meet those targets everyday.

You may also have seen our new message cards. These cards are being used around the school, to let parents know when their child has gone above and beyond, really impressing staff. A note will be on the back letting you know why your child received it. We ask that you display these proudly at home as their reward, as opposed to a present or prize as we are trying to instil self motivation for achievements as opposed to a physical reward.

Theses cards have replaced Capel Stars. The children and staff have expressed how the 'Capel Star' didn't always feel fair. Sometimes pupils were chosen because it was their turn, instead of for their achievements. It also limited us to one per week, which sometimes resulted in a pupil who had worked their socks off, not getting a star because another pupil also deserved it, or perhaps they had very recently had a Capel star. This way, we are able to genuinely reward and praise pupils without the limitations. Please look out for these special cards winging their way to your homes!
