Uniform

Following on from the reminder in the last Newsletter, we have had some questions which I would like to clarify.

- Pupils are welcome to wear trainers with their PE kits on the days that they are doing PE, but not with their school uniform please. Pupils wear black shoes with their uniform.
- Stud earrings can be worn, except on PE days, where we ask them to be removed before school. We understand that in some circumstances such as having just been pierced, they need to remain in. In these circumstances we will help your child to secure them with surgical tape for the duration of the PE lesson.
- The white PE shirts are absolutely fine to wear. This year we are transitioning over to the colour t-shirts, but please don't go and buy one specially if you have a white one already.
- School jumpers can be worn with jogging bottoms on PE days. As they are in them all day, and to keep our uniform looking smart and consistent, we ask that other blue jumpers are not worn. Some children may have plain, navy zip-up hoodies, which they may wear if they do not have a school jumper available.
- Navy blue Leggings or jogging bottoms are acceptable for PE days.

What's coming up at Capel over the next few months?

We have exciting plans and a few adjustments to our routines that we would like to share with you.....

- Birthdays—rather than receiving a certificate on a Friday assembly, children will now receive a
 birthday card on the day (unless a weekend) of their birthday in class. On our special Friday
 assemblies, they will still get a chance to tell us about their day and have the rest of the
 school sing them Happy Birthday.
- We have some exciting Enrichment activities coming up over the next few months with author visits, a special presentation from an owl sanctuary and some class trips.
 - A member of our staff is undertaking Forest School Training. Once qualified, we aim to provide each class with a term of Forest School Lessons. We are really excited about the possibilities that this opens up for us all and we know the children will gain so much from it.
 - Over the October Half Term, we will see The Haven being installed. This will be in the courtyard area, and will provide a nurturing space where children can have their emotional and sensory needs met. There will be a few changes in the area, with a small fence to ensure the new outdoor sensory area around The Haven remains a safe and secure place. We are working with the PTA to equip it with everything it needs. We will keep you updated with the progress as we prepare for it's opening in November.
- A local charity is doing a special cycle ride on 16th September. They will be going past our school at around midday. Some of our older children will be able to cheer them on from our front lawn area, to ensure they get a boost and are appreciated for their efforts.
 - We will be creating a Reading Army of volunteers soon. We are hoping to have a group of volunteers who are willing to regularly come into school to read with our children and we will be giving some training to those who wish to join us. A letter will be coming out soon.
