Our first activities of the day were the best. We did a treasure hunt where we had to find a lot of things like a milk container and an old phone box that we could still use today. Our second activity was to find the people who worked during the war like the ticket inspector and guard. We got to go in a Victorian carriage and we saw how small the carriages were. After that a lady told us about food rationing and we learned how to make chocolate spread. Then we learned about spivs from Viv the Spiv. Spivs were men like scammers who had watches, chocolate and Nylons (which are like tights).

As the day carried on, we went on the steam train. We ate our delicious lunch and I loved being on a table with Meralis, Jacob and Libby - we all had a ticket and we met soldiers who told us about the war.

When we stopped at a station we were billeted and went to do some cleaning. After that we went back on the steam train and met a lady called Margaret. She told us what it was like being an evacuee when she was five years old. It was great listening to her, when WWII started, she was scared she didn't know what to do.

I was sad that we had to leave; it was the best day ever.
