
# Weekly Newsletter

This week we learnt about a range of different diets and choices people have around this. We learnt about vegan and vegetarian diets and as a result made a vegan bean chilli. We discussed how this would provide protein and

lots of other important nutrients to power our bodies. We even got to dip tortillas into it!



In Science, year 4 have really enjoyed investigating the busy world inside our bodies this term! The children identified the organs that are part of the digestive system, labelled them and explained their simple functions using scientific vocabulary. They carried out an enquiry to find out the role of teeth (chewing) in digestion. They also did an experiment to see what happens to the food item when it reaches the stomach and where the absorption of nutrients happens. Children then extended their learning by creating a 3D model of the digestive system.

We had three professional musicians visit the school to take workshops in African Drumming, Samba and Composition. Each workshop gave the children new experiences and the opportunity to play different instruments and learn how to create a song.
