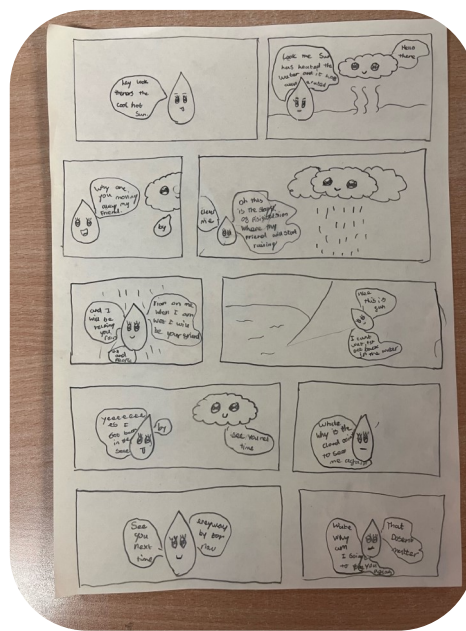


all those who bought cakes!
